Palatial and polished, this 10,000-square-foot estate overlooking Long Island Sound exudes quint-essential New England charm with its shingled upper floor and fieldstone base. Charles Hilton Architects sited the Shingle-style house in a linear manner to capture coastal views while crafting a floor plan that maximizes circulation throughout the first floor and to the adjacent porches. Exquisite architectural detailing inside and out combined with state-of-the-art systems and technology equals a home that scores major points for both style and sustainability.

reconfigured with today's families and functionality in mind. A successful project all round—proven by the fact that the 4,500-square-foot house sold shortly after it hit the market.






Excellence: New Construction LINDEN SHORE RETREAT



This year-round Linden Shore haven in Branford proves good things do indeed come in small packages. Clocking in at 1,520 square feet, the house (and detached two-car garage) beautifully manages a modest lot and exacting zoning regulations. Architect Joseph Sepot designed a long, narrow home that exudes the vintage charm and traditional detailing characteristic of nineteenth-century cottages. An open floor plan, unobstructed frontto-back views, and a screened porch that runs the width of the house lets the charming home live large.

The second-generation owners of this beloved family home in Guilford hoped to return the 1863 Italianate house to its original splendor. Among the many renovations, Campaigne Kestner Architects swapped an old addition with a new one that comprises a modern kitchen, mudroom, and primary suite. While it was important to incorporate all the present-day bells and whistles in terms of comfort and convenience, the architects were careful to preserve the grand home's historical roots. The "new" old house is now ready to welcome the next generation.
