AN OLD WORLD WINE CELLAR

Antique hand-hewn beams and barn siding were fitted with new matching oak storage racks in this 250-square-foot cellar on the basement level of a French Normandy-style residence in Greenwich, CT. Several thousand bottles can be stored here, with areas for standard, magnum and jerobäum bottle storage, as well as space for crates. Although it has an antique look, it features seamlessly integrated modern technologies, such as a digital scanning system that logs and organizes the collection. hiltonarchitects.com
