1. Rustic refinement. This guesthouse wine cellar in Greenwich, Connecticut, includes custom-constructed oak storage. "In looking at French buildings, a lot of the towers are for pigeons and open on the ground floor, so you see the timber construction all the way up. So we did that here too, but finished in between the timbers," architect Charles Hilton says. Limestone and brick pavers on the floor connect the exterior and interior.
