
Bath Design





Inspired by the working farm at Marie Antoinette's Petit Hamlet on the grounds of Versailles, this new house was designed to reflect a French Normandy barn. A steeply pitched graduated slate roof, pierced with engaged timber dormers and walls of half-timbering, in-filled with rustic terra cotta brick tiles, gives the house its unique rustic character. The dramatic central great room is the home's focal point, and a walk-in Carmague limestone fireplace sits counterpoint to a double-height bay window that has views across the home's extensive gardens.
